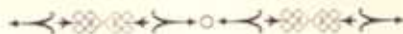

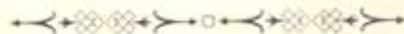

GREAT CARNIVAL IN AID OF ST. JOHN'S HOSPITAL, LIMERICK,
JUNE 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, & 13, 1903.

ST. JOHN'S HOSPITAL was erected in the year 1787. Through the exertions of Dr. Geary it was much enlarged in 1846; and in 1888 the Nursing Staff of "The Little Company of Mary" got charge of it. It stands on that part of the old wall before which Bruce, Ireton, and William of Orange fought.

St. John's Gate and the guard house, built in 1495, form part of the Hospital. Many memories cling to both. At the gate the unhappy Wentworth Knighted Domnic White, and there were presented to Rinuccini the flags captured at Benburb. In the guard room was imprisoned that fair Geraldine whose smiles, men said, were more powerful than swords; and from the guard rooms Bishop Hely was led to martyrdom at Kilmallock.

On the Hospital grounds once stood the famous Black Battery whose grim power Storey the Williamite historian so graphically describes.

Well, let the past bury its dead. We look to a future of larger hope, and expect that the CAMUIN DÁN Fete will enable the Hospital to save the life of many a bread-winner, and enable its governors to procure suitable accommodation for a nursing staff, whose zeal is untiring, and skill second to none.

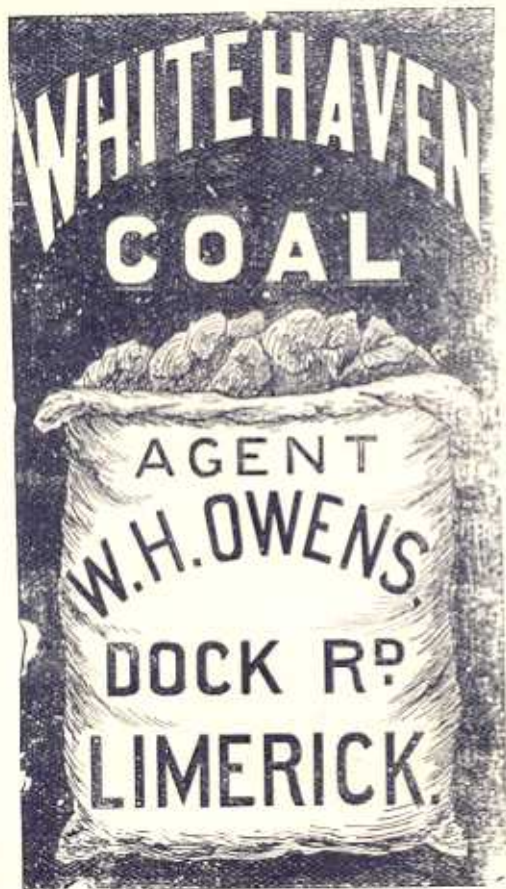

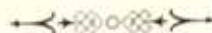

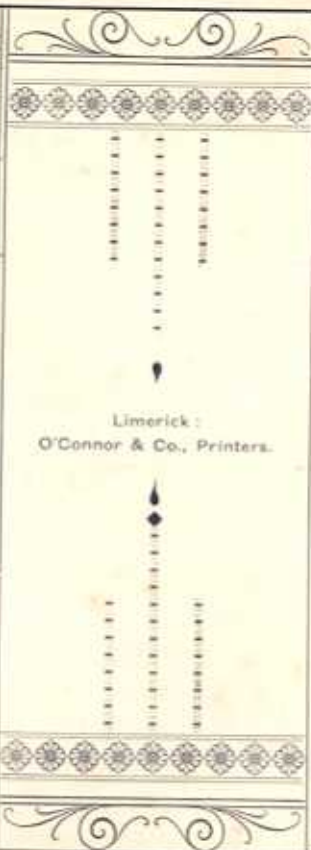
